**CONCEPT NOTE AND AGENDA**

**1. 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP: Call for Action – “Acting Together for our Future Sustainability”**

The 12<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Roundtable for Sustainable Consumption and Production (12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP) will be held at the Apsara Angkor Hotel in Siem Reap, Cambodia on 12 and 13 July 2016 with back-to-back events on 14 July 2016. The meeting is organized by the Asia Pacific Roundtable on Sustainable Consumption and Production (APRSCP) and is hosted by the Ministry of Environment, Kingdom of Cambodia, in partnership with the International Institute for Scientific Research (IISR). The 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP is supported by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) through the SWITCH-Asia Regional Policy Support Component (RPSC) of the European Union (EU) and by other partners including EU SWITCH-Asia Network Facility, the Network on Resource Efficiency and Cleaner Production (RECPnet) with the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and the China National Cleaner Production Center (CNCPC).

**2. Theme**

The 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP theme is "Call for Action - Acting Together for our Future Sustainability." The meeting is calling for action on developing and implementing innovative policy solutions, scaling up technology transfer and strengthening knowledge sharing on approaches for best practices on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP). The 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP will draw from the results and recommendations of the concluded activities and events of the EU SWITCH-Asia Programme in 2015-2016, the 10 Year Framework of Programme on SCP (10YFP), the Sustainable Development Agenda 2030, and related APRSCP research and projects, such as the preparation of the Asia Pacific SCP Roadmap.

**3. Objectives**

The Objectives of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP are as follows:

- Share progress and promote best practices, programs, local initiatives and lessons learned on SCP-related initiatives including resource efficiency, green growth, green economy and sustainability related policies and activities to strengthen the implementation of the SDGs in Asia and the Pacific region.
- Identify synergies and build cooperation to engage actively in the implementation of the Asia Pacific Roadmap on SCP.
- Share experiences and lessons learned in scaling up existing and new SCP strategies, tools and approaches through research and information awareness, capacity building, technology transfer, innovative financing, and monitoring and evaluation.

**4. Expected outputs are the following:**

- Recommendations on how stakeholders could contribute to the implementation of the Asia Pacific SCP Roadmap at the regional and national level.
- Recommendations for regional and national programs/activities for research, communication, capacity building, technology transfer, financing and monitoring and evaluation to scale up SCP best practices and initiatives.
- Recommendations on national implementation of SDG 12 (“Responsible Consumption and Production Patterns”) and other SCP related SDG targets and indicators.

## 5. Rationale of the Agenda:

The 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP will have a combination of plenary sessions and five concurrent roundtables that will contribute to the output of the event, which are recommendations to the overall outcomes of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP. The selection of priority thematic issues to be discussed under the plenary and concurrent roundtables are based upon previous decisions of APRSCP Board and partner organizations involved in the preparation of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP.

### *a. Plenary Sessions*

The 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP Roundtable will have three plenary sessions. The first plenary session: “The Call for Action: Acting Together for our Future Sustainability through SCP” will discuss the Asia Pacific SCP Regional Roadmap, which is a result of a regional consultation workshop and online consultation to identify key thematic priorities and activities (e.g. institutional strengthening, policy development and implementation, policy-science interface, capacity-building, partnerships, and resource mobilization) to achieve and promote SCP at regional and national levels within the next three years.

The second plenary session: “Post UNEA 2: Delivering on the Environmental Dimension of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development” will discuss the result of the second session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-2) which was held in May 2016 in Nairobi Kenya. The discussion will be on the decisions reached on issues pertaining to SCP and how to strengthen/build partnerships, including the private sector and civil society.

The third plenary session will be the presentation of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP Plenary and Parallel Roundtable Conclusions as well as the Angkor Declaration prepared by the Ministry of Environment, Cambodia as host of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP.

### *b. Roundtable Sessions*

There are five Roundtable Sessions focusing on selected priority areas on SCP:

- 1. Sustainable Food Systems and Agriculture**
- 2. Sustainable Cities and Livelihoods: Green economic growth and social inclusiveness**
- 3. Sustainable Tourism**
- 4. Education and Sustainable Lifestyles**
- 5. Eco-labeling and Sustainable Public Procurement**

Each Roundtable will have two sessions where speakers (resource experts and country representatives) will present on the selected topics followed by interactive discussions and insights from participants. The roundtable session will contribute to the objectives and output of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP. Afterwards, all sessions will convene and report in the closing plenary session.

### *c. Closing Plenary*

There will be a closing plenary session at the end of the DAY 2. The highlights of all plenary and parallel roundtable sessions will be summarized and reported. After the closing remarks, the APRSCP banner will be handed over to the next host country for the 13<sup>th</sup> APRSCP, which will be in Malaysia in 2017.

### *d. Special Sessions organized by APRSCP Partners:*

The three special sessions are side events organized by partner organizations of the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP. The results of the sessions will also contribute to the 12<sup>th</sup> APRSCP objectives and outputs. The Special Sessions are the following:
